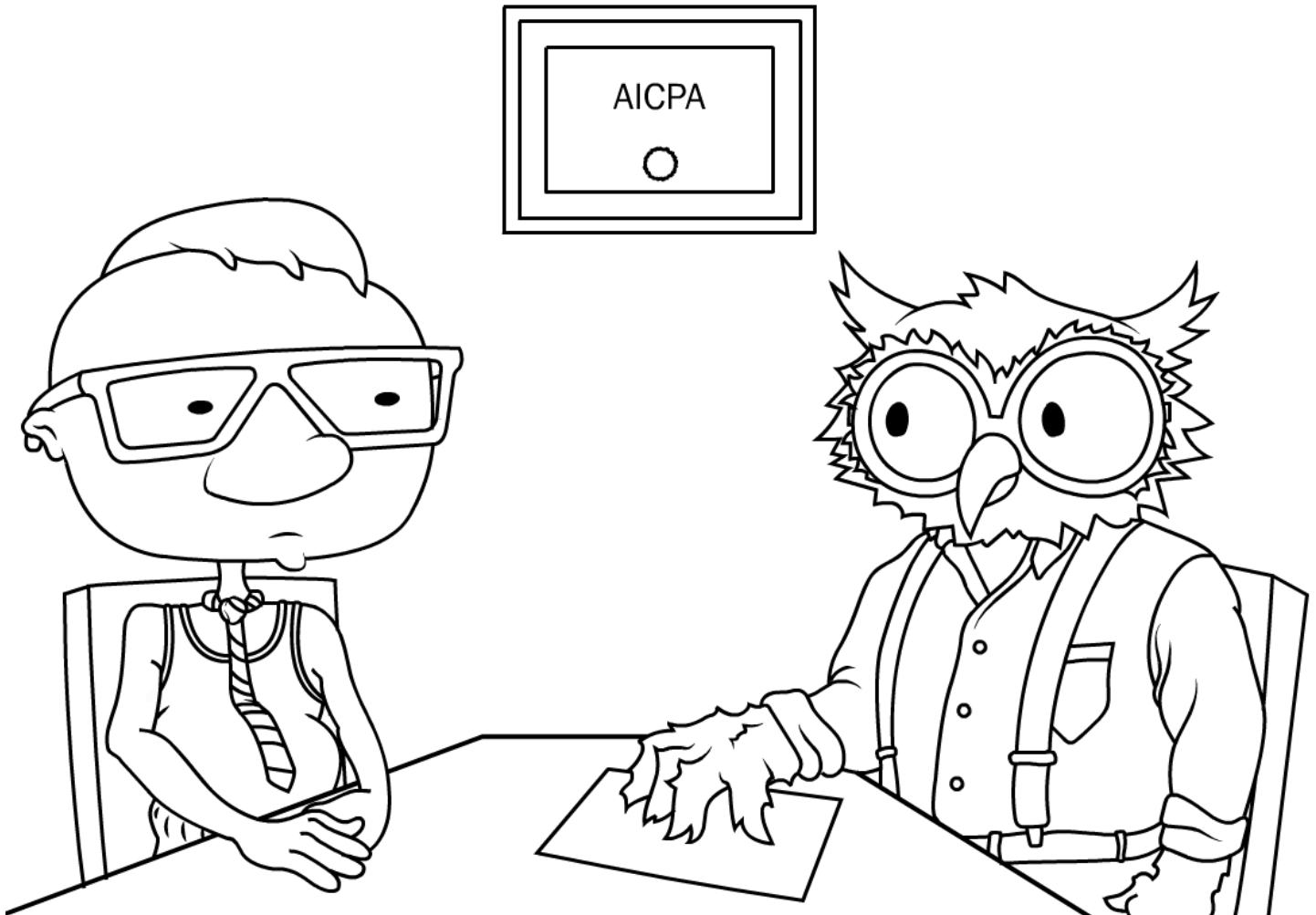


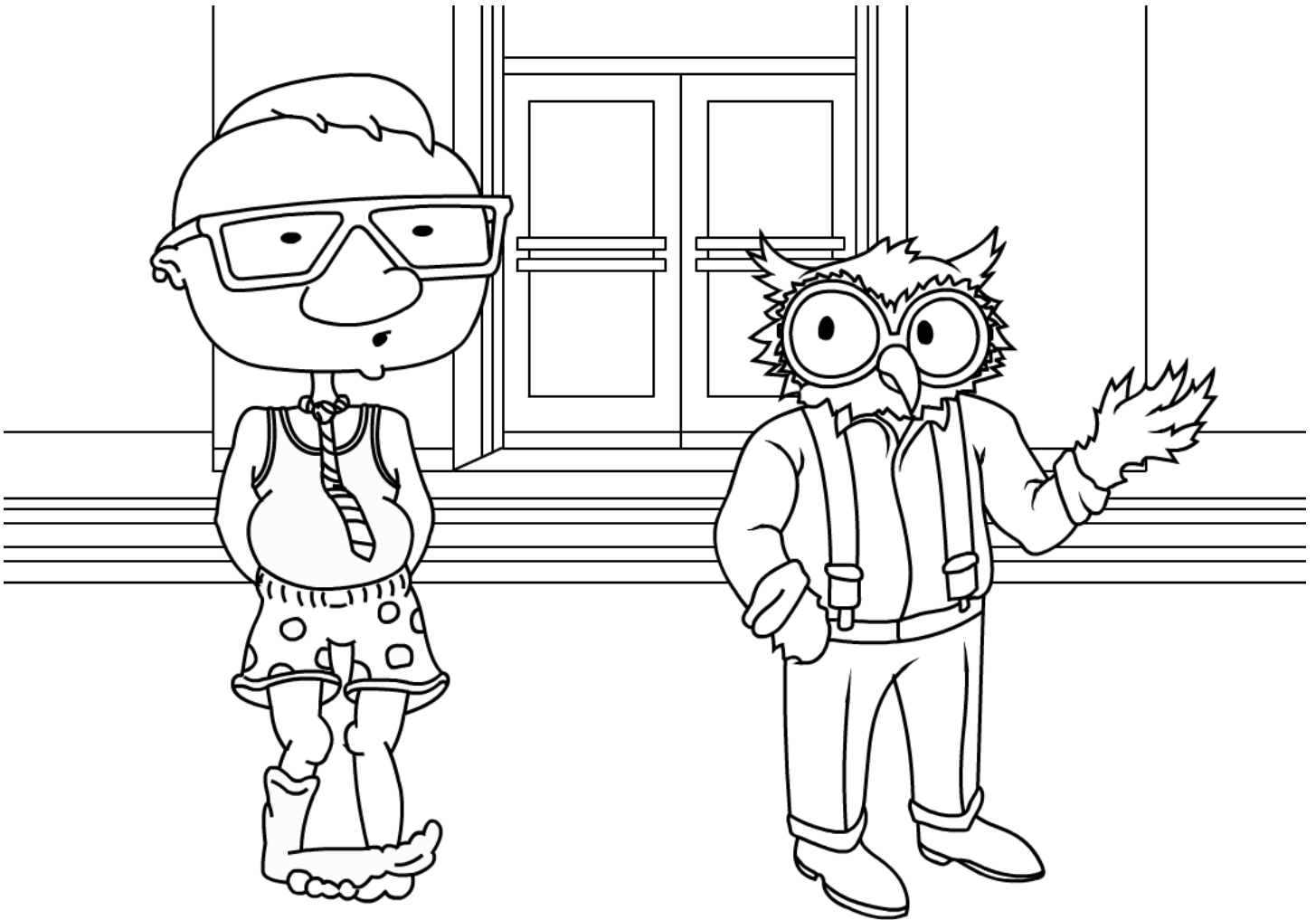
# Why do We Pay Taxes?

**Who suggested a real life “show and tell,” so they left his office and took a walk. As they walked, Who explained to I. B. that taxes are used to support federal, state and local programs.**





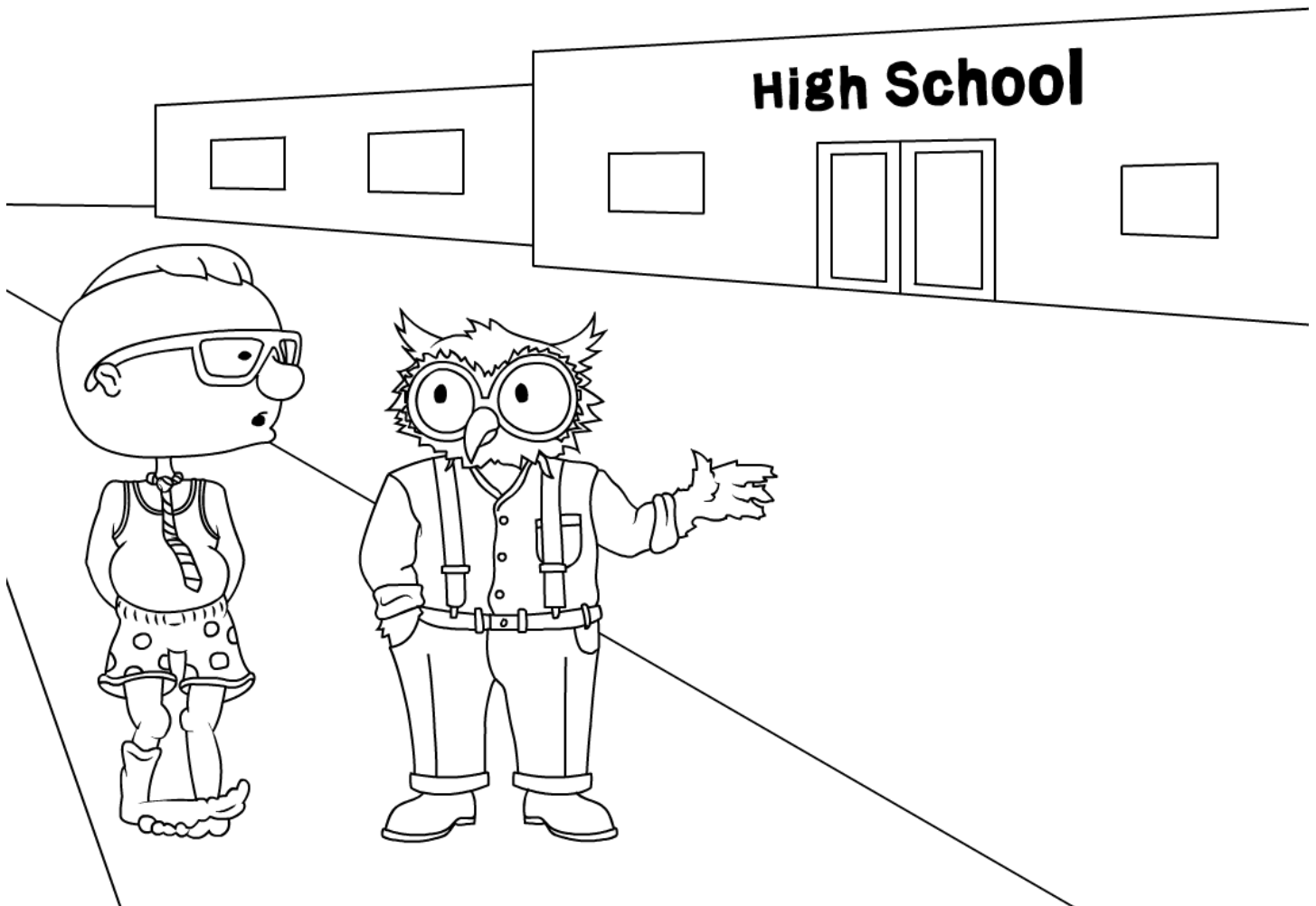
**They passed a military recruitment center and Who pointed to it. He said to I. B., “That is an example of our federal tax dollars at work, to support our national defense (military).”**





**They walked a little further and Who pointed to a building housing the Social Security Administration offices. Who explained the Social Security Administration is another example of our federal tax dollars at work.**





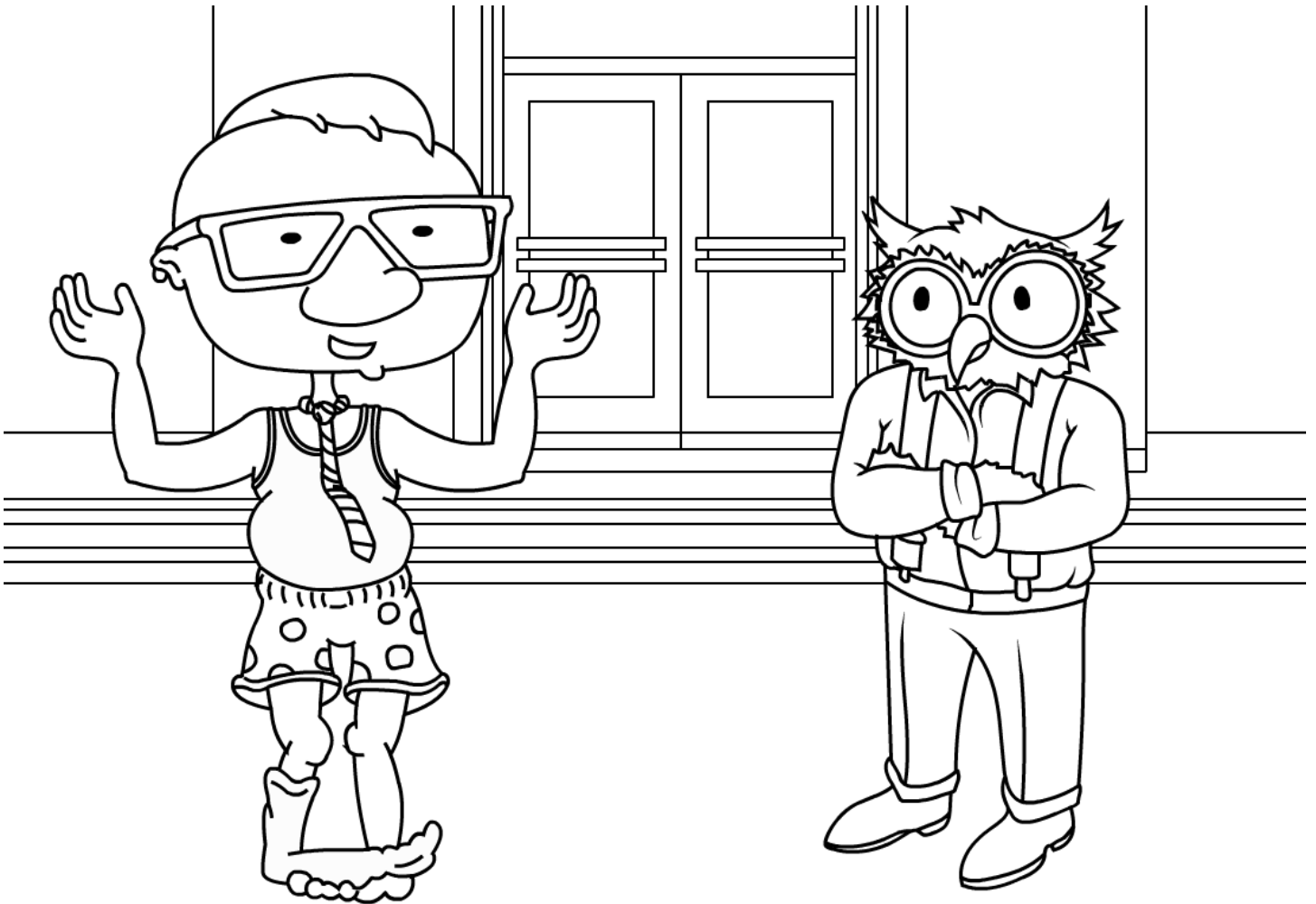
**Walking on, they passed the public high school I. B. attended. Who told him his and other public schools, as well as the state highway located behind the school are supported with state tax dollars.**
